The Asia-Europe survey (AES) was organized as part of the democracy project led by Takashi Inoguchi at the Institute of Oriental Culture at the University of Tokyo. It was funded by the Japanese Ministry of Education, Culture, Sport, Science, and Technology.

The surveys were coordinated by the Nippon Research Center, Tokyo, and conducted by Gallup International.

The Asia-Europe survey's main topics are identity, trust, satisfaction with life, beliefs and actions, and socio-economic attributes. Across these areas, the rise of civil society and the deepening of globalization are reflected.

Multi-stratified random cluster sampling procedures were employed, with national variations. The sample size is about 800 in each country. For details on each country, please refer to the [Fieldwork Report](#).
