The main topic is the standard of living and welfare in the Scandinavian countries. This includes living standards, experiences of self-realisation, alienation, happiness, dissatisfaction, income, property, employment, social equality, education, health and so on. In addition a number of biographic variables were included, both the ordinary ones (sex, age, and so on), and more particular ones (intensity and duration of friendships, relationships with family and relatives, hobbies, and so on).

A multistage random sampling procedure was used. Face-to-face interviews were conducted.
